How Canoe Meadows Wildlife Sanctuary Helps Birds

- We maintain bird habitat, including mowing some fields in order to keep them open for species that require early successional habitats.
- We monitor bird populations including coordination of the Southern Berkshire Christmas Bird Count, and we participate in Mass Audubon's Breeding Bird Atlas II.
- Each year volunteer monitors report their county-wide bluebird nesting success to us. Our volunteer Berkshire Bluebird Project coordinators assemble this valuable data and forward it to Cornell Laboratory of Ornithology.

 We help protect Piping Plovers, tern species, and coastal habitat at 90 sites in southeastern Massachusetts.

Your sightings will be stored in a database that Mass Audubon scientists can use to track birds on our sanctuaries. Help us collect important data by participating in Mass Audubon bird monitoring programs including the Oriole Project, the Whip-poorwill Survey, the second statewide Breeding Bird Atlas, or our sanctuary breeding bird surveys.
